



APPLYING FOR FUNDING THROUGH LICHFIELD LANDS

Lichfield Lands is an incorporated company that uses its profits to support Christian ministry within New Zealand via a trust. It has its roots within the Open Brethren movement.

CRITERIA

CCCNZ Youth are partnering with Lichfield Lands to support local church initiatives that meet the following criteria:

1. **The initiative must target young people.** Rather than a whole church initiative it must specifically target intermediate aged young people, teenagers and/or young adults.
2. **The initiative must have a discipleship focus.** While not every aspect of the initiative needs to focus on Christian discipleship or evangelism, the overall intent of it must have these as its focus.
3. **The initiative must involve more than one CCCNZ/Open Brethren church.** Our tagline is “Together Works Better”. We want to encourage churches to work together and support one another, by undertaking initiatives that will benefit more than one church.

If churches wish to apply for funding that don't meet these three criteria, they are welcome to apply to Lichfield Lands directly for funding without CCCNZ Youth involvement or endorsement.

APPLICATION

Applications for funding can be made to the CCCNZ youth enabler at murraybrown@cccnz.nz.

Applications must include the following:

1. A description of the initiative including how it meets the above criteria.
2. An outline of what outcomes are anticipated.
3. A description of why funding is needed and how it will be used.
4. A simple budget that shows what funds the church will raise and contribute itself toward the initiative and what funding shortfall currently exists

Please keep your application brief – aim for a single page if possible. If you need help or advise in preparing your application, let us know.

Once your application is received, we will assess it and request more information if necessary. We will then add our own recommendation to your application and forward it on to Lichfield Lands for consideration.
